The Course of Landscape Architecture conducts educational research related to theory and technology that enables the safe and beautiful construction and management of living environments that coexist with nature in the hope of revitalizing cities and localities, and building a sustainable society with a reduced impact on the environment.

Environmental landscaping design studies at Chiba University have a longer history than at any other school in Japan. Building on accumulated landscaping knowledge, this field builds a comprehensive study system which considers a diverse array of environmental problems. Using landscape gardening history and modern landscape theories, education and research is carried out for the cultivation of specialist technicians and researchers with expertise in design theory and techniques related to spatial form.

As of July 1, 2020, the Landscape Program (Design, Planning, Architecture) comprises four professors, six associate

professors, and one assistant professor.

(4) Qualifications

For this opening, we are looking for someone to take responsibility for the specialized field of Environmental Landscaping Design within our Landscape Program.
